School Improvement Plan Update

We had purposeful discussion at our May INSET, with all staff engaging in our School Improvement Plan evaluation. We asked staff to highlight the successes over the year. Here is a snapshot of some of the feedback – with a short description for some explaining what these comments refer to:

- ✓ Interventions in Literacy & Numeracy and upskilled support staff (additional support for some identified pupils or small groups over a short time period to measure impact)
- ✓ NELI (this is a focused Literacy intervention which is new to our ELC and in our second year in our infant class)
- ✓ Greater consistency regarding behaviour
- ✓ Residential to Lockerbie Manor
- ✓ Attention Autism
- ✓ World of Work Week
- ✓ Enhanced transition from ELC to Primary 1 (we provided more opportunities for our pre school learners to visit room 1 and familiarise themselves with the environment, resources etc)
- ✓ Cycling Friendly Award, Bikeability and bespoke support to those who needed help to ride a bike
- ✓ Focused attendance tracking and support to families
- ✓ Forest Schools
- ✓ Silver Sports Award, clubs led by pupils, visiting specialists and staff

'Cost of the School Day' We continue to try to keep costs as low as possible during the course of the school year, however we appreciate there are times in the year where there is more of an outlay for families, such as preparing for a new school year in August. Please remember your child does not need to come to school with their own pencil case and pencils, all class are fully equipped with all the resources they need and sometimes pencil cases from home can be more of a distraction!

Our school uniform is grey trousers/skirt/pinafore with white shirt/blouse/polo shirt and maroon sweater/cardigan. Plain white polo shirts from supermarkets are the most cost effective. There is no separate PE kit. School ties are kindly provided for by our Parent Council during the transition visits. Children who join part way through the year are offered pre-loved items, if available in their size. 'Book bags' are provided for by the school for pupils starting Primary 1.

Parents on certain benefits can access a clothing grant to help with school uniform costs. There is information about entitlement to clothing grants and how to apply on the SLC website

We also have access to funding which gives families a 'helping hand' during times of difficulty. The grants are there to help people by providing individual items that can make a huge difference to family life – such as white goods, beds and mattresses to aid restful sleep, grocery and clothing vouchers to support the purchase of essentials. We will deal with each enquiry with the utmost confidentiality.
